Course Title: Christian Counselling – Year 3 (High Diploma)

Level: High Diploma

Duration: October 2025 – June 2026

Course Objective

This course aims to provide students with advanced training in Christian counselling by deepening their understanding of the basics of Christian counselling, expanding their skills in different types of counselling, and strengthening their knowledge of abnormal psychology. Students will also become familiar with selected counselling theories and psychotherapeutic approaches. The objective is to equip students with the knowledge and skills necessary for competent and effective Christian counselling practice.

Learning Outcomes

Upon successful completion of this course, students will be able to:

- Understand the differences between secular and Christian counselling and the integration of Christian faith with psychology.
- Recognise the role of the Holy Spirit and Christian spirituality in counselling and psychotherapy.
- Identify motives and prerequisites for serving in Christian counselling.
- Understand and apply the stages, techniques, and criteria of the counselling process.
- Conduct first and repeated counselling sessions with proper skills, communication, boundaries, and ethical standards.
- Analyse and work with different types of counselling cases, including marital, family, child, adolescent, separation, divorce, infidelity, and telephone counselling.
- Identify and understand symptoms of psychiatric disorders and classifications according to DSM-V.

- Recognise and evaluate mental health issues, OCD, substance abuse disorders, personality disorders, behavioural disturbances in children, and suicide.
- Demonstrate familiarity with selected counselling theories and psychotherapies.
